Clinical Experience:

After pre-registration training I was a casualty officer in London, a GP for a year in the UK and Canada and then a surgical registrar for four years in the specialities of general surgery, gastro-intestinal, vascular, urological and paediatric surgery. Orthopaedic training centred on the St Thomas' hospital programme in London and with extensive training in the rest of the UK and abroad

Present and Immediate Past:

I am a consultant Orthopaedic and Trauma surgeon (General and upper limb) in Coventry and Warwickshire. I was the Clinical Director for Orthopaedics and Trauma for the UH C&W NHS Trust for nearly 6 years (1998-2005). I am in full time NHS practice, trauma and elective.

This unit is sizeable and expanding. It provides services for Coventry, Rugby and parts of Warwickshire. The unit has a heavy trauma workload and provides high quality integrated elective care in the majority of sub-specialities in Orthopaedics. The unit has twenty one orthopaedic consultants and associated junior staff. In 2002 an Academic unit was established with the appointment of Professor Damian Griffin as Professor of Orthopaedics (at Warwick University). The majority of Warwick University medical students are taught Orthopaedic surgery in our unit.

I have accumulated experience in all the main areas of Trauma and Orthopaedic surgery; Hip and Knee, Shoulder, Elbow, Hand, Spinal, Foot and Paediatric

Hand and Upper limb Surgery:

In addition to General Trauma and Orthopaedics my specialist interest is in hand and upper limb surgery. About 70% of my workload is now upper limb.

Audit and Continuing Medical Education:

Regular monthly audit meetings and attendance at meetings and training sessions to keep CME in date. Our unit has a yearly appraisal programme.

Teaching:

Regular commitment, Orthopaedic surgeons in training, medical students and others. Lecturing on outside courses, including legal seminars on personal injury.

Publications / Research:

Peer reviewed research and clinical publications in general orthopaedic and hand journals. Also Presentations to societies, book reviews etc.,

My research interests are in hand injuries, particularly tendon damage.

Medicolegal Practice:

I have been providing medical reports for Personal Injury cases and Medical negligence for over 20 years. This is a good proportion and an enjoyable part of my private practice, and amounts to about 300 reports per year. My reports are independent, impartial and addressed to the court. I have never signed a formal contract with any medicolegal agency but I do very occasionally accept instructions from them. Almost all of my work is direct referral from solicitors. My instructions are split approximately 50/50 between defendant and claimant. An increasing number are joint reports. I have attended court on a number of occasions over these years and given expert evidence in court when requested.

Fees: All fees have attracted VAT since March of 2007

For up to date information please contact the Medicolegal service at Oak House (024 7656 1968) but as of October 2008 the usual fees are:

£400 - £450 Review of casenotes only (unless very complex and time consuming)

£450-£475 Joint reports with other consultants at the Court's

request

£450-£500 For the majority of reports when the patient is seen

and a review of medical records is needed. VAT is now added to each report. There would be additional fees for the occasional complex cases or if there are extensive medical records to review. I have only rarely charged more than £600 for non-negligence cases. I accept all requests for reports on a cab rank principle unless the report is clearly better done by another specialist when I will advise the solicitors

accordingly.

Cancellation charges for failure to attend for examination:

No fee is charged for one missed appointment for examination since in my experience this is often the result of a communication error. However if, unusually, a patient fails to come for a second arranged appointment a fee of £400 is charged.

Other fees:

£1000 - £1500 For medical negligence reports, depending on the

complexity.

Court fees:

£850 Court attendance, half day in court, plus travel and

accommodation expenses if incurred.

£1700 Full day in court plus travel and accommodation

expenses if incurred.

Court Case Cancellation:

No fees are charged if notification of cancellation is received more than 7 calendar days before the proposed trial date. It is much appreciated if as much notice as possible can be given so my normal clinics and operating can continue. The NHS insists on 8 weeks notice of cancellation of clinics and operating lists. It is possible to arrange alternatives at shorter notice but this does represent a real problem for NHS Consultants who also do medicolegal work.

One half day fee (£850) is charged for cancellation and preparation etc if booked attendance at a court case is cancelled less than 7 calendar days before the first day of the trial.
